CREATION CARE NEWS

Immanuel Solar Update

Immanuel's solar panels will soon have been operating for two years. The SolarEdge monitoring application measures the amount of electricity generated since our church solar sys went operational (on June 7, 2022). Click on this link Immanuel Church-on-the-Hill to see what our solar panels generate each day, week, month, or year.

Environmental Benefits:

As of April 30, 2024, our solar panels

- Prevented emitting over 178,000 pounds of carbon dioxide into the atmosphere, equivalent to
 - O Planting 1,342 new trees or
 - Supplying a year of carbon-emissions-free electricity for 17 houses (per U.S. Energy Information Administration, average annual electricity consumption for an American household in 2021 was 10,632 kWh)

• Generated 72% of the electricity Zabriskie Chapel-Parish Hall needed between January and December 2023—nearly three quarters of the electricity our church needed for the year came from our clean, sustainable solar panels!

Cost Savings for 2023:

70 % Savings on Electricity Bills: Even though the church building used about the same amount of electricity in both 2021 (pre-solar) and 2023 (12 months of solar), because our solar panels generated 72% of the electricity needed during 2023, Immanuel only spent \$2,906.41 on Dominion electricity bills – a savings of \$6,808.21 over what we spent on electricity in 2021 (\$9,714.62).

• **Bonus – SREC Payments:** In addition to electricity bill savings, Immanuel <u>receives</u> approximately \$3,150/year from the Virginia Solar Renewable Energy Credit (SREC) program. SRECs are a performance-based incentive that let a solar system's owner (Immanuel Church on-the-Hill) earn additional income from solar electricity generation. **Immanuel received \$3,146.70 for the solar electricity generated by our panels during 2023**.

When Immanuel's 2023 SREC earnings (+\$3,146.70) are applied to its 2023 electricity costs (-\$2,906.41), <u>Immanuel spent less than \$0 on electricity last year!</u> In fact, the solar panels gave us a net positive of + \$240.29. Let us celebrate this fragile earth, our island home, and cut our carbon emissions wherever and whenever we can!!!

Solarize Alexandria, a program that provides residents guidance and resources for installing home solar power systems, is holding its annual campaign **through Sunday**, **June 30**, **2024**. During this period, Alexandria homeowners can sign up to receive a free solar satellite assessment of their property and discounted prices from vetted solar system installers.

This year marks the 10th anniversary of Solarize Alexandria! Solarize Alexandria is part of the broader Solarize Virginia program, a grassroots, community-based outreach initiative managed by the state non-profit Local Energy Alliance Program (LEAP).
